Eat Me First

Laksa is taking centre stage tonight, with prawns as its leading lady. Our version is a take on the Singaporean laksa lemak, and uses coconut and lime to draw out the bold Asian flavours.

### Pantry items

Olive Oil, Soy Sauce, Brown Sugar

## Before you start

Wash your hands and any fresh food.

If you're cooking for 6, use the 2 people plus 4 people ingredients and cook meat and veggies in batches

## Cook the noodles

- Boil the kettle. Half-fill a medium saucepan with boiling water.
- Cook **udon noodles** over medium-high heat until tender, **3-4 minutes**.
- In the **last minute** of cook time, gently stir **noodles** with a fork to separate.
- Drain, rinse and set aside.



## Cook the prawns

- Add **tail-on prawns** to the saucepan and cook until pink and cooked through, **3-4 minutes**.



## Get prepped

- Meanwhile, finely chop **garlic**.
- Thinly slice **carrot** into half-moons.
- Roughly chop **Asian greens**.
- Zest **lime** to get a pinch and then slice into wedges.
- Thinly slice **red onion** and **long chilli** (if using).



## Finish the laksa

- Add **Asian greens** and **cooked udon noodles** to the saucepan. Cook stirring until wilted and combined, **1-2 minutes**.
- Remove from heat then add a squeeze of **lime juice**. Season to taste.



## Start the laksa

- In a large saucepan, heat a drizzle of **olive oil** over medium-high heat. Cook **onion** and **carrot**, until slightly tender, **3-4 minutes**.
- Add **garlic**, **Southeast Asian spice blend** (see ingredients) and a good pinch of **lime zest**. Cook, stirring, until fragrant, **1 minute**.
- Stir in **coconut milk**, the **water**, **soy sauce**, **brown sugar** and **fish sauce & rice vinegar mix**. Bring to a boil then reduce to a simmer, **2-3 minutes**.



## Serve up

- Divide Singaporean prawn and coconut laksa between bowls.
- Garnish with **chilli**. Tear over **coriander**.
- Serve with any remaining lime **wedges**. Enjoy!
